Communication: Students are introduced to different forms of communication and their various uses. They learn that different media and audiences require different approaches both for consuming and producing messages.

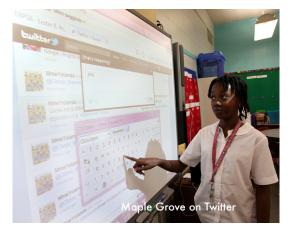
Awareness: Students learn their rights with technology and the responsibilities that come with those rights. Proper etiquette is introduced and cyberbullying is addressed.

Intormation Literacy: Students are taught strategies for searching, evaluating, organizing and using digital resources.

Safety and Health: Students learn that it is important to protect themselves as they navigate the digital world. This includes creating and managing passwords, dealing with spam, privacy and protecting their digital footprint as well as the importance of maintaining a balanced lifestyle.

Digital Citizenship is not a set of strict rules; instead it is a way to understand the challenges facing all technology users. In the 2010-2011 school year teachers, administrators, consultants etc. collaborated to construct the DCP curriculum for the LBPSB. This year, the DCP will be extended as part of the curriculum for students in the classroom. The focus now will be to ensure that teachers, administrators and staff members are aware of the learning goals of the DCP and that we work towards integrating them into the existing curriculum. Featured DCP Lesson Plans

Remember, the DCP is not intended to be an "add-on". It can be incorporated into the existing curriculum. Here are a few lessons to try out.

Understand Your Acceptable Use Policy From: Common Sense Media Inc

Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) contracts encourage responsible behavior by students and staff and give administrators enforceable rules for acceptable use of school computers. In this lesson, students will interpret and make inferences about their school's Acceptable Use Policy.

This lesson is perfect for English Language Arts or Ethics for Elementary Cycle 2 students as it has students interpret a written document and synthesize what they have read. It can be easily adapted for all levels. This lessons addresses the DCP category of "Awareness"; specifically dealing with 'Rights and Responsibilities". A good time to use this lesson is when you hand out the Technology Permission Form.



Promoting Ethical Behavior Online - Our Values and Ethics

In this three-part lesson, students learn about online privacy and ethical behavior. In part one, they create a digital map of their Web-based activities. In part two, they analyze their online activity and in part three, as a class they look at the areas they can improve on by sharing and discussing the topics.

This lesson plan is a great series of lessons for Secondary Cycle 1 students in Ethics and Religious Culture. It addresses the DCP categories of "Awareness" and "Health and Safety" with a focus on Cyberbullying, privacy and digital footprints.
